This document contains the Minima Paddlesport Standard Operating Procedure which should be read in conjunction with the overall Minima Paddlesport risk assessment. However, specific risks relevant to the Standard Operating Procedure are included.

## **Standard Operating Procedure**

This section contains the Standard Operating Procedure and covers the following scenarios:

A Higher qualification shall be either a PaddleUK Explore award or a PaddleUK Touring award. b) Permitted only if the trip is in the club calendar or has been authorised or sanctioned by a club leader or coach. c) May only operate between the northern most tip of Trowlock Island, Teddington and Hampton Court Bridge. d) River conditions as determined by the environment agency must be green boards / no board.
